## **NYSDOT SCHEDULES PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING REGARDING A HIGHWAY PROJECT**

### **March 24th Meeting to Discuss Project on NY Route 281 From Luker Rd to Fisher Ave, Town of Cortlandville and City of Cortland, Cortland County**

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) will hold a Public Information Meeting on Monday, March 24, regarding a Highway Reconstruction and Bridge project on NY Route 281 in the City of Cortland and Town of Cortlandville, in Cortland County. The meeting will take place from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m. in the Bonne Auditorium, Homer Intermediate School, 58 Clinton Street, Homer, N.Y. Drawings and Displays for the upcoming project will be available for review, and representatives from NYSDOT will be present to answer questions.

This project is phase 2 of a 3 phase project to reconstruct and widen the section of NY 281 from the NY281/NY 13 intersection north to the Interstate 81 access road intersection with NY 281, just south of the Homer High School.

Construction was completed on phase 1 in the spring of 2010. This project, phase 2, has a tentative bid opening date of February 2015, and a tentative construction completion date of the Fall of 2017. This project addresses the portion of NY 281 from Luker Road to Fisher Ave. Included in this project will be the reconstruction of the NY281/NY222 intersection, and the Replacement of the NY281 Bridge over Dry Creek.

Phase 3 has not been scheduled.

This open house is part of the continuing effort by the department to inform the public regarding the details of this project.
